The Deacon: Called To Serve: On Sunday 17 June at 3pm in St Michael's Church, Enniskillen, Martin Donnelly of Enniskillen will be ordained as the first permanent deacon in our diocese since the diaconate was re-introduced by Vatican II as a 'distinct ministry of service'. All are welcome to witness Martin's ordination.

Who Can Become A Deacon? At present, candidates for the permanent diaconate are men. Pope Francis has set up a Commission to look at the possibility of women being ordained as deacons. A candidate for the diaconate should, ideally, be actively involved in some aspect of lay ministry or leadership in the community. Married men can become deacons. The ministry of deacon is usually exercised on a part-time voluntary basis. A deacon may hold full-time employment although such employment must not conflict with his responsibility. A married man must be aged thirty-five and under sixty before he can be accepted as a candidate and the formal consent of his wife is required. In fact, wives have an opportunity to be involved in the formation programme. Candidates for the diaconate should have a good general familiarity with the Gospel and an understanding of the Church's mission. A well-founded spirituality and sacramental life is also among the requirements.
