World Meeting Families Registration: Due to high demand, those wishing to go to the WMOF18 are strongly advised to register immediately. Single-day registration for Friday 24 Aug is no longer available. Indications are that the RDS will be booked to capacity for this event. To assist those who may not be able to manage their own online registration, the Parish Office will do it for you. A parish bus is booked for Thursday 23rd August for the World Meeting of Families Congress at the RDS, Dublin and a second bus for the Closing Mass on Sunday 26th August in Phoenix Park. A day ticket for the Congress is €38, concession is €33 and this also entitles you to attend the Closing Mass. The Parish Office will take names of those wishing to travel on the bus on August 23rd & 26th. Details of (free) ticket arrangements for the Papal Mass in the Phoenix Park will be available shortly. One of the most significant and beautiful events within every World Meeting of Families is the **Festival of Families**. This concert-type event will take place in Croke Park Stadium in Dublin on the evening of the 25th August 2018. It is a celebration of family life around the world that will feature musical and dance performances, as well as five selected families from around the world giving witness to their family's faith. The Festival of Families is a free ticketed event. Every person in attendance will require a ticket to access the venue. Tickets will be limited subject to venue capacity and availability.

THE DEACON: CALLED TO SERVE: On Sunday 17 June at 3pm in St Michael's Church, Enniskillen, Martin Donnelly of Enniskillen will be ordained as the first permanent deacon in our diocese since the diaconate was re-introduced by Vatican II as a 'distinct ministry of service'. All are welcome to witness Martin's ordination. On Monday 18 June, Deacon Martin will preside at Evening Prayer of Thanksgiving in St Michael's Church at 7.30pm. We are all asked to pray for Martin, his wife and family and the whole parish community of Enniskillen during the days ahead.

Training To Be A Deacon

The admission process for a deacon is similar to that for a priest. After a preparatory year, those candidates considered suitable and are accepted must begin a three-year formation programme, with classes held mostly at weekends. This is a substantial commitment to the study of Scripture, Theology, Liturgy and Canon Law. The rich tradition of Christian spirituality will be a key part of the formation period. Other aspects will include the development of personal and pastoral skills, including a pastoral placement for a time in the diocese.
