Drive-by Communion for the Housebound: Fr. Chester will be available to offer prayer and Holy Communion to the housebound in the church car-park (beside the Heritage Centre) at St. Tierney's on Sunday 5th July at 11.30a.m. In the event of a funeral Holy Communion will be available from 12 noon.

The Return to Mass in Roslea Parish:

Thankfully we seem to be rising slowly out of lockdown. Places of worship have been granted the go ahead to hold public worship from this week. Masses in the parish of Roslea will commence on Wednesday 1st July. However the return is a phased one and not a return to normal. Though economic pressure has pushed distancing to 1 metre the churches of Roslea Parish will operate for now under the 2 metre rule which allows use only of one third of the seats, and therefore the capacity of St. Tierney's Church is 38 (ground floor only) and St. Mary's Church (2 people per seat) 28. The patrons of one household may sit together. The Sunday obligation is still dispensed and therefore patrons, where possible, are encouraged to seek on-line Mass until the time is right when people can gather together without restriction.

Weekday Masses: These will be reserved to the family of the Mass intention and town-lands allocated to that Mass. This will enable attendance within capacity. Ushers will guide patrons to a pew. Names and phone numbers will be recorded for the purposes of contact-tracing. Patrons are required to sanitise hands on entry. The allocation of town-lands to each weekday Mass will hopefully afford patrons across the parish of the opportunity of Mass attendance over the course of a few weeks. The success or otherwise of the system will be assessed.

Weekend Masses are reserved to the family of the Mass intention only. Each intention may have no more than 10 family members present.

St. Tierney's Church: Entry only by the Women's porch and exit through the Men's porch.

St. Mary's Church: Entry through the main door and exit through the fire door.

Offerings: Patrons can make their offering/contribution to the parish on entry. A collection box will be in situ. There will not be an offertory collection during Mass. Patrons may wish to deposit the parish envelopes that may have built up since March. Thank you!

Holy Communion will be on the hand only. The celebrant and special ministers of the Eucharist will sanitise hands immediately before Communion and wear a visor for the distribution of Holy Communion.

A deep-clean of surfaces will follow after every liturgy. The church will be closed to allow for the clean.

Volunteers: A special thanks to those who came forward as volunteers for ushers/stewards, and cleaners. More will be required after the system gets up and going, depending on how long restrictions continue.

Choirs and altar-servers will resume at a later stage in the phased return. For the moment it is recommended that an organist and cantor render the music.

Mass Intentions: Mass intentions for the rest of the year will be honoured. Contact the Parish Office if you wish to book a Mass for this period. Bookings for 2021 will commence in September. Contact the Parish Office if you wish to rebook an intention scheduled during the lockdown which you were unable to see on –line.

GOSPEL for 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew 10:37-42

Anyone who does not take his cross and follow in my footsteps is not worthy of me. Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me.

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows :

‘Anyone who prefers father or mother to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who prefers son or daughter to me is not worthy of me.

Anyone who does not take his cross and follow in my footsteps is not worthy of me.

Anyone who finds his life will lose it; anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it.

Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me; and those who welcome me welcome the one who sent me.

Anyone who welcomes a prophet will have a prophet's reward; and anyone who welcomes a holy man will have a holy man's reward.
