- Saturday: The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Saturday: The Feast of the Assumption – theologians throughout the centuries reflecting on Jesus' entry into the world and his resurrection considered the repercussions these events had for Mary. They concluded that Jesus the Lord bestowed upon his mother VIP treatment at the moment of death, brought her to heaven at that precise moment. '*Assumption*' is the word used in the western Church whereas the eastern Church refers to 'the *dormition* (*sleep*) or *transition* or *passing* of Mary'. In Irish tradition Mary is called '*Bean Tí na Tríonóide*', the *Home-carer of the Trinity*. Mary is saved, most saved and the one most deserving of inclusion in the inner life of the Trinity as intercessor remembering us before the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. SCRIPTURES FOR THE 19TH SUNDAY:

FIRST READING: 1 Kings 19:9. 11-13
When Elijah reached Horeb, the mountain of God, he went into the cave and spent the night in it. Then the word of the Lord came to him saying, 'What are you doing here, Elijah?' Then he was told, 'Go out and stand on the mountain before the Lord. Then the Lord himself went by. There came a mighty wind, so strong it tore the mountains and shattered the rocks before the Lord. But Yahweh was not in the wind. After

the wind came an earthquake. But the Lord was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake came a fire. But the Lord was not in the fire. And after the fire there came the sound of a gentle breeze. And when Elijah heard this, he covered his face with his cloak and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave.

GOSPEL: Matthew 14:22-33

Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side while he would send the crowds away. After sending the crowds away he went up into the hills by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, while the boat, by now far out on the lake, was battling with a heavy sea, for there was a head-wind. In the fourth watch of the night he went towards them, walking on the lake, and when the disciples saw him walking on the lake they were terrified. 'It is a ghost' they said, and cried out in fear. But at once Jesus called out to them, saying, 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid.' It was Peter who answered. 'Lord,' he said 'if it is you, tell me to come to you across the water.' 'Come' said Jesus. Then Peter got out of the boat and started walking towards Jesus across the water, but as soon as he felt the force of the wind, he took fright and began to sink. 'Lord! Save me!' he cried. Jesus put out his hand at once and held him. 'Man of little faith,' he said 'why did you doubt?' And as they got into the boat the wind dropped. The men in the boat bowed down before him and said, 'Truly, you are the Son of God'.
