TODAY we mark the 106th World Day of Migrants and Refugees The theme chosen by the Holy Father for 2020 is "**Forced like Jesus Christ to flee**". In his message the Holy Father says:

'Displaced people offer us this opportunity to meet the Lord, "even though our eyes find it hard to recognize him: his clothing in tatters, his feet dirty, his face disfigured, his body wounded, his tongue unable to speak our language".

'We are called to respond to this pastoral challenge with ... four verbs: **welcome, protect, promote and integrate.**

'To these words, I would now like to add another six pairs of verbs that deal with very practical actions and are linked together in a relationship of cause and effect:

You have **to know** in order **to understand.**

It is necessary **to be close** in order **to serve.**

In order **to be reconciled,** we need **to listen.**

In order **to grow,** it is necessary **to share.**

We need **to be involved** in order **to promote**

It is necessary **to cooperate** in order **to build.'**

The Gospel for the 26th Sunday: Matthew 21:28-32

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people: 'What is your opinion? A man had two sons. He went and said to the first, "My boy, you go and work in the vineyard today". He answered, "I will not go", but afterwards thought better of it and went. The man then went and said the same thing to the second who answered, "Certainly, sir", but did not go. Which of the two did the father's will?' 'The first' they said. Jesus said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, tax collectors and prostitutes are making their way into the kingdom of God before you. For John came to you, a pattern of true righteousness, but you did not believe him, and yet the tax collectors and prostitutes did. Even after seeing that, you refused to think better of it and believe in him.'
