Parish Priest: Last Monday a close contact informed me that their Covid Test result was positive. Therefore I am required to self-isolate until Tuesday 3rd Nov. Fortunately my test

result was returned as negative, meaning I do not have the virus. The 9.30a.m weekday Masses are cancelled until Tuesday 3rd Nov, fortunately none carry an intention. The priests of Clones Parish have kindly agreed to look after the Friday 7pm and Sunday 10.30a.m Masses.

Deep Clean: St. Tierney's Church will undergo a deep clean on Monday.

Church Restrictions in Northern Ireland:

Weekday and Sunday Masses continue as normal but all attending must wear masks, unless for an underlying health condition, especially on entering and leaving St. Tierney's Church. All weddings in the parish in 2020 are postponed. Weddings are currently limited to 25 people with no reception. Funeral Masses are currently limited to 25 people, as well as the committal, and no gathering for refreshments after the burial. Baptisms may take place but only with parents and god-parents in attendance.

Restrictions in the Republic of Ireland –

Nationwide Level 5 restrictions until the end of November mean no Masses, weekday or Sundays in St. Mary's Church. Funerals are limited to 25 people. Baptisms are deferred until the restrictions are relaxed.
