DIOCESE OF CLOGHER TO HOST ONLINE TALKS ON THE CALL TO PARISH MINISTRY

As part of the continuing process of Clogher Diocese in Dialogue, an initiative begun by Bishop Larry Duffy in early 2020, there will be three online talks on the Call to Parish Ministry during the season of Lent. Everyone is welcome to attend these virtual seminars which can be accessed via the diocesan website www.clogherdiocese.ie and the Diocese of Clogher Facebook page www.facebook.com/dioceseofclogher.

The online talks will be on

- **Wednesday 10 March:** Speaker – Dr Gareth Byrne (Mater Dei Centre of Catholic Education, Dublin City University) on

reimagining the link between school and parish today

- **Wednesday 24 March** (Feast of St Macartan): Speakers – Various lay people involved in a range of ministries across the Diocese of Clogher today – how they come to be there; what they do and the importance of their ministry to the life of the parish.

Each of the talks will begin at 7.30pm and the online event (including a period of prayer and an opportunity for general discussion) will last approximately 40 minutes each evening. No booking will be necessary.

Trócaire - Lent is an important time for Trócaire. This year the theme is around solidarity with those families affected by war in South Sudan. Their campaign focuses on two widows, Awut and Ajak brought together after having fled war. Both also lost their husbands to war. They try to stay strong but lack so many of life's basics – proper shelter, food, access to clean water, and health-care. They also lack seeds, tools and training to feed the ones they love in a changing climate.

SUNDAY'S GOSPEL: *Mark 9:2-10*

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Rabbi', he said it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus.

As they came down the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.
