The Death of Bishop Emeritus Liam MacDaid: Bishop Liam died unexpectedly on Tuesday while holidaying in France. A native of Bundoran, born in July 1945, he was ordained on 15th June 1969. He joined the teaching staff of St. Macartan's College, Monaghan in 1970 and was President from 1981 – 1989. He served in Brookeboro, Coonian and Fivemiletown from 1990 – 1993 after which he was appointed Diocesan Secretary, Chancellor of the Diocese and Administrator of the Parish of Tyholland. He was ordained Bishop of Clogher on 25th July 2010 and led the diocese for over six years until his retirement on health grounds on 1st October 2016. One of his final acts as Bishop of Clogher was to install me as Parish Priest of Roslea at the Vigil Mass in St. Tierney's Church on 24th September 2016. May he rest in peace. (The Parish Priest)
