The Sacrament of the Sick: The Sacrament of the Sick will be celebrated after each of the two weekend Masses. Paragraph 1505 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church reads, *‘Moved by so much suffering Christ not only allows himself to be touched by the sick, but he makes their miseries his own: “He took our infirmities and bore our diseases.” But he did not heal all the sick. His healings were signs of the coming of the Kingdom of God. They announced a more radical healing: the victory over sin and death through his Passover. On the cross Christ took upon himself the whole weight of evil and took away ‘the sin of the world’, of which illness is a consequence. By his Passion and death on the Cross Christ has given a new meaning to suffering: it can henceforth configure us to him and unite us with his redemptive passion.’*

Paragraph 1532 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church reads: *The special grace of the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick has its effects: - the uniting of the sick person to the Passion of Christ, for his own good and that of the whole Church; - the strengthening, peace and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age; - the forgiveness of sins; - the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of the person’s soul; - the preparation for passing over to eternal life.*
