STATEMENT FROM BISHOP LARRY DUFFY FOLLOWING WEDNESDAY'S TRAGEDY IN MAGUIRESBRIDGE, CO FERMANAGH

I am deeply shocked and saddened by the tragic news of the death of a mother and two children near Maguiresbridge yesterday. While we do not know all the circumstances surrounding this tragedy, I am very aware that the news is causing deep distress in the community of Co Fermanagh and beyond.

I assure the family of the deceased, and everyone affected by this tragedy, of my prayers and assure them of the prayerful support of the wider community.

As Christians, we are people of faith-filled hope. This hope, rooted in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, teaches us that light will always overcome the power of darkness; evil will not have the final say. With such thoughts, let us pray that those who mourn and are in pain will know the consolation and love of God in these days and always.

World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly – 27th July 2025

In recent years the Sunday closest to the Feast of Ss. Joachim and Anne has been designated as 'World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly'. This year that Sunday falls on 27th July 2025. The National Pilgrimage of the Catholic Grandparents Association takes place that day in Knock with chief celebrant Archbishop Francis Duffy.

This is the 5th World Day, and the theme is 'Blessed are those who have not lost hope' (Sir 14:2). Grandparents and the Elderly are central components of the life of every parish. He calls on every parish/diocese/movement to become a "protagonist in a 'revolution' of gratitude and care".
